SWAT Team Trains at SBRETC

On Tuesday, October 20th, the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department SWAT Team was called out to the San Bernardino Regional Emergency Training Center (SBRETC). Instead of rushing to a scene to respond to an emergency, the more than 30 officers arrived on site to participate in a hands-on half-day training exercise.

As part of their first visit to the facility, SWAT Team members sought out the SBRETC because of the presence of a "real" aircraft. The SBRETC's full 727 plane used for aircraft rescue and firefighting trainings fit the bill. Post-event comments from the SWAT team revealed that the facility was a good fit for their needs and they would like to return again.

"Our mission is to provide quality emergency and disaster training for the aviation industry and emergency response community. We strive to collaborate with all agency and departments to further promote emergency and disaster training," said June Yamamoto, Dean for Career Education/Human Development and SBRETC Administrator.

Wild Land Training with 71st Fire Academy

Fire Technology Students Volunteer Time at NASCAR Race for Charity

When the popular NASCAR racing circuit came to Fontana in October, approximately 60 CHC Fire Technology students and cadets from the 71st Fire Academy volunteered their time for a "Fill The Firefighter's Boot" fundraiser at the California Speedway. Donations from the four day event raised more than \$17,000 for the Burn Institute of the Inland Empire that sends burn survivor children to the Camp Beyond Scars.
