

The Associate of Science degree in Humanities emphasizes the study of cultural, literary, humanistic and artistic expression within the context of the human experience. Students will evaluate and interpret the ways in which people in different cultures have responded to themselves and the world around them throughout history. This degree is multidisciplinary, preparing students to transfer into majors such as history, English, philosophy, religious studies and other areas in the humanities.

To complete the requirements for the Associate of Arts for this degree\*, a student must:

1. Complete the requirements for an associate degree.
2. **Complete a minimum of eighteen (18) units with a "C" or better in each course** in the following multidisciplinary program.
3. Complete elective units to meet the minimum 60 units required for the associate degree.
