State Budget Update	Budget crisis: Seismic shift. May Revise Update: Losses have doubled from what it was in 2008. 54 billion shortfall for the state. However, LAO stated 18 to 31 billion. Changes in funding: Reduction in GF and Categorical Programs by 1.1 billion reduces our GF allocation by 10%, which may amount to a 10-11 million cut. 30% = 3 million to Crafton. The governor's plan will eliminate COLA, reduce Strong Workforce by 55%, reduce categorical by 15%, and existing construction projects are planned to continue. EOP&S & DSP&S are not being cut. Priorities are to maintain 2019-20 FTES. Protect the core. State is funding Capital Projects
