State/District Budget Update and 2020-21 RAM/Multi-Year Forecast	June 30, Newsom signed the FY 2020-21 State Budget Act.  1.5 billion in deferrals and no cuts. Congress may approve a stimulus package.	We will know more in October and that will help us go forward.

	District used the State's forecast and developed three scenarios. Best case is not happening.  Middle case assumes a stimulus package will be passed from Congress.  Worst case, no stimulus and we will end up with a mid-year 10% deferral.  Reduces out fund balance to 5.42%, the State mandate for fund balance is 5%.	
	The district used the middle case scenario to forecast multi-year scenario.  We had some unfunded FTES last year and we are projecting a shortfall of 2% being held back by apportionment.  District reserve is healthy and will help us continue. We are concerned about our growth for the future.
