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# Educational Master Plan Committee CHC Mission Statement, Vision Statement and Values Survey Results


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## Introduction

The Educational Master Plan Committee (EMPC), a Crafton Council shared governance committee, discussed possible revisions to the Crafton Hills College Mission Statement, Vision Statement and Values during the 2012-2013 Academic Year. EMPC in conjunction with the Office of Institutional Effectiveness, Research, and Planning (OIERP) developed a web-based survey for interested employees and students to inform the committee's ongoing discussions. The purpose of this report is to illustrate the results of the survey.

## Summary of Results

- Majorities of employees and students believe the CHC mission statement (84%), vision statement (83%), and values (83%) reflect CHC's current educational purpose, direction, and values.
- Students were more likely than employees to believe the CHC mission statement (89% to 66%), vision statement (88% to 59%), and values (89% to 59%) reflect CHC's current educational purpose, direction and values.
- More students supported the theme "Help Students Reach Goals" (40) than any other theme, while more employees supported the theme "Teach Students" (13) than any other theme for Crafton's reason for being.



- 17% of the 169 respondents provided comments to the open-ended questions regarding the mission statement, vision statement, and values.

## Methodology

The web-based survey contained 8 total questions. The first question asked respondents whether they were an employee or a student. The second, fourth, and sixth questions asked whether the respondent believed the CHC mission statement, vision statement, and values reflected CHC's current educational purpose, direction, and values, respectively. The third, fifth, and seventh questions were open-ended questions, which allowed the respondent to provide statements or comments regarding the mission statement, vision statement, and values, respectively. The final

question was an open-ended question, which allowed respondents to provide any additional comments. The employee survey was available from January 28, 2013 to February 13, 2013, and the student survey was available from February 13, 2013 to March 7, 2013.

Advancing the education and success of students" is a vague statement in my opinion. 'Advance' them towards what? 'Successful' as defined by what end goal or achievement? Also, the interior of some of the buildings on campus don't provide for what I would consider a "quality learning environment", and I wouldn't consider some of the teachers I have had "quality educators" either. However, the exterior campus scenery is absolutely beautiful and motivates me to want to be on campus and enjoy the view and some of the teachers I have had were excellent and provided me with relevant useful skills. The one consistent activity I perform every semester is working toward completing a specified list of courses to obtain a degree to make myself more appealing to employers in the job market.
CHC required too many class for the basic requirements that are not related with the choice of major. Also, they don't provide many choices of majors.
Crafton Hills College or any college for that matter is not established just "to advance the education and success of students in a quality learning environment," but also a gate way to the learning and teaching of oneself and other "self's." When one surrounds themselves with people of different perspectives, religions, cultures, and of a different ethnicity one becomes self-aware, hence making the student successful in life not only in "a quality learning environment."
I believe you need to identify the groups that attend the college and why they attend the college and ensure that you capture those goals in the statement.
I have been very unhappy with the lack of respect the students are showing to the instructors and the lack of control that many instructors have over their classrooms. I have seen this happen a couple of times in past years, this semester is by far the worst.
It is too general. That could be the mission statement of any college in America. Crafton has a very specific audience and most of the time goes the extra mile to make sure their students succeed. The mission statement should not only reflect that, but demand it.
So far in my college experience, the advancement of my education has been facilitated, but the advancement of my success leaves something to be desired. A couple of classes I've taken so far have in fact made me a more successful student. Particularly English 102 with Hamlett and Chemistry 100 with Salt. These teachers had not only vigor and passion to teach the subject, which many teachers in my experience do have, but they were really just great professors. They organized their classes very well, carried through with assignments and tests, and I saw them to be very professional in how they conducted their classes. These teachers helped me to become a better student. Aside from the teachers, the counselors haven't been of any help to me to advance my success. Given, I only went in once to an academic counselor, but it was a bad experience. I came in with an education plan and asked him if it was accurate; he then used the whole appointment to do what I had already done, but just for one school instead of the 5 or 6 I wanted to apply for. I just suppose he didn't understand me. I don't use the services all that much and have come to researching on my own, as I'm skeptical of what advisers may tell me.
Some of the professors don't create, in my opinion, a "quality learning environment". Also it seems the main purpose of this college is for students to get in and out quickly and go on to an university.
The mission statement has not been accurate in my experience in schooling because of the quality of teachers you guys have. Some teachers do not show up, some teachers act to ... to be teaching a class. Some are too old to teach a math class. There have only been a few teachers who I thought were on par with this mission statement.

If transfer preparation is a third goal then maybe it should be reflected in the mission statement also.
again - our vision is too narrow. We need to empower our students intellectually, socially and physically. And to understand they can and will make a differences if they engage and become active contributing members of our democratic society.
It seems narrow given that some of our students are not interested in transferring or public safety/health service careers. It makes faculty members who are not a part of those programs, feel like they are not contributing as much. I would suggest adding a third part to the vision statement..."The vision of Crafton Hills College is to be the premier community college for public safety and health services careers, transfer preparation, and students' individual development." (or something similar)
The current vision statement is too narrow and excludes some programs and services. Where do other workforce development programs fit? We have existing programs such as CIS and Business, and emerging programs such as Digital Media, and potential programs such as solar technology and music technology, that don't seem to fit the vision. Also, it does not align with our values. It seems to me we would want to be "visionary" in our attempts to be creative/innovative, learning-centered, and focused on student success.
There are other certificates students may obtain at CHC that are not part of public safety and health services, such as business and computer training. I think our vision needs to include rather than exclude them.
I believe our vision is changing. I think it should reflect student success more closely. There's a good chance that, eventually, our funding could be tied to student success rates and our mission and values should drive planning and should be about student success from the beginning.

The line is correct, but I think the order is wrong. The "transfer preparation" should be first because it is the primary part of this.
It doesn't reflect the current reflection because I don't believe it really is set up to help us transfer. More needs to be done there.
Based on my experience with some of the members of the staff, I have found it very difficult to be able to express some of our grievances as students. The people in charge of "quality control" were not willing to listen and to investigate. The tenure offers a "safety net" to some people who take advantage of their "immunity".
I am confused on what the vision statement is saying. I take it as saying that Crafton Hills College is to be the premier community college for public safety, health services careers and transfer preparation. If that is what it is saying I understand the health services careers and transfer preparation, but not so sure about the public safety careers. We don't even offer any classes in public safety that I am aware of.
The vision statement is accurate in half of its means. Crafton is an excellent school to go to for public safety and health services (aka. Fire Academy and EMT), but transfer preparation is lacking. Transfer preparation is not of "premier community college" quality because the breadth and depth of its course offerings leave much to be desired. The majority of your faculty is great transfer advocates, but the simple truth is that the classes lack the variety needed for students to effectively explore their potential majors/careers and finish major prerequisites. I would change the vision to contain a phrase dealing more in the inclination of Crafton to inspire transfer. But transfer preparation, you can't include that in your vision as one of the premier qualities of Crafton. Not now, not yet. Not when we have no budget to enlarge course offerings.
If there not enough classes, it takes longer to reach the transfer goals
there are areas on the campus that could be improved for the safety and convenience of all students. As for transfer prep, having different counselors instead of having a personal counselor would be helpful--different counselors sometimes don't necessarily agree, and this can be frustrating as well as confusing
Because classes that CHC required for basic requirements do not necessary used in the advance major choice.
The vision of Crafton Hills College needs to be geared more towards student achievement and preparation rather than just state they are a premier college. Being a premier college does not reflect student success and that should be incorporated in the vision. For example, Santa Monica College is known for its high transfer rates.... "We are the leader among the state's 112 community colleges in transferring students to the University of California, University of Southern California and other four-year campuses. We also pride ourselves on preparing students for careers of the 21st century – in such fields as nursing and health care, solar technology and other 'green' careers, entertainment technology, computer technology, early childhood education, business, graphic design and other occupations."
I think it should also include something about Crafton's child development program because from my experience and the experiences of my peers, Crafton's program is one of the best in the area.

I really don't see that administrators, faculty, and employees demonstrating these adjectives on a day to day basis. If you going to have a values statement then the entire organization must be engaged in developing it.
We are not learning centered, in my opinion. We are "change" centered and "money" centered. We will call anything promoting learning to get grants, even things we know do not benefit the learning environment as a whole.
would like to see words like supportive, caring, holist, student focused, safe, helpful,
The values of CHC are stuck in the old ways of doing things with a huge resistance to change. The CCC system is rapidly changing, we need to change with our changing global economy before it passes us by.
Values help us to understand what we are for, what we are about, etc. They don't say anything about HOW we want to achieve our mission. To say, for instance, I want to achieve my mission in such a way as to reflect my value of creativity isn't really saying anything substantive at all as far as HOW is concerned. . .
I think all the values listed are accurate, but I would like to see something about preparation, that we value our ability to prepare students to succeed. I think CHC students should leave us feeling confident that they can compete and succeed. So maybe adding something about confidence/preparedness.
These values are what the college aspires to, not what the actual values are at this time. Budgeting has hindered creativity. The decision making process is top heavy and only superficially includes lower level employees. Excellence has never been defined or given a rubric. The lack of resources for professional development that is user-initiated is virtually non-existent, and learning activities are neither rewarded nor celebrated.

It would seem the word preparation needs to be here as one of the primary goals is preparing those to enter the workforce and be effective contributing members of their chosen field and also to prepare the transfer students to learn all they can here and have good learning and study skills to be successful in the four year arena.
For the most part the statement works, but inclusiveness needs some work for those students who have physical issues.
I think in order for Crafton to achieve their vision statement they will need a lot more than creativity and inclusiveness. There should most definitely be hard work included. I would also consider including "a positive learning environment" in the values. My best classes at Crafton (and the ones I have been most successful in) were the classes where the students were friendly, the professors were encouraging, and I wasn't afraid to ask questions. I positive learning environment is essential to being successful and achieving our goals individually and as a college.
CHC needs to choose work with the basic requirement classes.
I do not feel that within the core classes, i.e. science and math, there is enough creativeness going on. Other then that I feel satisfied that i am learning quite well.
Your current Values do not say how you will achieve your mission and vision only that they are your values.

Talented and passionate professors, convenient class schedules, reasonable costs and a pleasant atmosphere are the characteristics that identify this campus and these characteristics will ensure the attendance of many future generations. Crafton has a long-standing reputation of being a premier educational institution. Keep up the good work!
I think they are generally succinct and proper. Most of them flow reasonably well though the emphasis on transfer needs a little primacy. If some way could be found to make the mission statement have the cadence of verse without changing the language much, I think it would help the readability. For example, a word change or two that would cause a cadence to the stressed points of the words. My largest objection is that ethics or morals has not made its way into any of these. This is a decided lack in American society (just look at politicians and the recent fraudulent studies by certain scientists) and that creates a need for stressing strong, ethical values in institutions of learning.
The vision is great and fits perfectly.
Why is this important? I have never heard of the Crafton Hills mission, vision and value statements until just now. If this is for funding purposes, everything looks good.
Let students know very clearly where Crafton is going to take them and what is required to get there.
<b>Various minor adjustments recommended (n=5)</b>
I think creativity shouldn't come before learning-centeredness in the Crafton Values statement.
It could use some polishing, but it's a good start.
I think a few words that indicate how well Crafton offers education in many areas preparing students for further successful education in their chosen field of endeavor. I was a bit put off by the vision statement's accent on public service and health, although I know what a first rate Fire Academy is in place.
The Crafton Hills College mission, vision, and values, should always be held at a higher standards. This means that students need to overcome their own subjective views of the college life and become a part of the learning community by "Getting involved". Working together and sharing ideas makes the learning community work for both colleges and the public.
I filled out your survey the other day and it has been percolating in the back of my brain ever since. I came up with something better than what I said. In my comments I put forth that ethics or morals needed to be included. The improvement I came up with is the exact phrase, "promote integrity" as part of what CHC is about. If this were in the list of core values or goals, I feel it would be quite appropriate. If you look at the rules put forward by the college, morals or ethics in the form of promotion of integrity is embodied in them. Academic dishonesty can an expulsion level offense. Sexual harassment is not permitted. Equal access is required. These are all issues of adherence to a code of standards as set forth by the college and district, which is integrity. There is one other reason I feel integrity is highly needed to be emphasized. That is the same reason I mentioned in my earlier missive. We have had world wide issues with integrity amongst learned people. The general public is also has issues, but I am focusing here on those with degrees as it is applicable to CHC. From the impeachment hearings of former President Clinton to the the falsified studies of Korean STEM cell research and British Autism research and on to the relaxing of banking regulations even as experts were saying housing prices and mortgage rates were untenable, we have had serious issues with ethics in educated individuals. It seems obvious to me that it is in the best interests of all of us for institutions of education to take on the promotion of high standards in response to these issues. I do not think these institutions are at all to blame for the problems. However, education has been proven to be an effective component in solutions almost all social issues. Therefore, taking on the responsibility of promoting integrity as an educational core value seems only logical to me.
<b>Focus on Transfer (n=4)</b>
I managed to finish my time here at Crafton within two years, but I am most definitely the exception. I would like to see mention of Crafton having an inclination towards a speedy graduation, transfer, or certificate. Crafton Hills faculty, staff, and administration must not forget that it is an institution to be passed through. We have done well to enhance the sometimes brief experience of students here, but really the goal needs to be focused on the path ahead.
Given the current state of the state budgets and the personal budgets of families it would make sense that more students/parents will choose the community college option as a path to a 4 year degree and the current mission, vision and values should reflect the schools commitment to ensuring the success of this group of students.
