The governing board, or its designees, and the academic senate shall reach mutual agreement by written resolution, regulation, or policy of the governing board effectuating such recommendations.

Proposed California Career Pathways Trust Project	<p>(pg 3) “The proposed project is to offer 150 California Cadet Corps (CACC) cadets in four San Bernardino City Unified School District (SBCUSD) high schools and one Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) independent charter school (North Valley Military Institute – NVMI) a four year program...</p> <p>The proposed project will create cohorts of 30 students at each of the five schools who will be offered intensive support during their high school careers to successfully complete as many as 100 semester units of community college course work across academic disciplines (English, math, communications, allied health, personal and career development, anatomy, chemistry, business administration, emergency medical services, fire science, biology, kinesiology, and microbiology) that would result in eligibility for an Associate’s Degree and certification as Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs), Firefighters, respiratory therapists, or radiologic technicians.”</p> <p>Proposed Freshman Year Courses: Math 090 & 095, COMMST 100, PCD 111, Health 102, Anat 101, Chem 087 & 101, PBSF 101, 102, 103 & 115.</p> <p>Proposed Sophomore Year Courses: Math 102 & 103, Health 263, Eng 101, Anat150, 151.
