2. Action Items

COURSE MODIFICATIONS

A. MATH 903X4 Math Support Lab

This course will be scheduled for a set unit and will be linked with one of the corequisites listed below. This course will provide additional support to the student.

The committee agreed to approve MATH 903X4 with revisions. The corequisite of Concurrent enrollment in MATH 942, MATH 952, MATH 090, MATH 090A, MATH 090B, MATH 090C, MATH 095A, MATH 095B or MATH 095C were also approved.

- **NEW SEMESTER UNITS:** .25 – 1
- **NEW SEMESTER HOURS:** LAB: 12 – 48
- **NEW CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** Support materials, workshops and individual tutoring related to the linked math course. Development of math specific study skills, strategies to overcome math avoidance, and approaches to reduce math anxiety. These skills will be practiced in the linked math lecture course. Graded on a Pass or No Pass basis only. Not degree applicable. This course may be taken four times.

NEW COURSES

A. ACCT 032X4 Federal and State Taxation

This course provides knowledge and skills regarding taxation and tax preparation to business students planning to transfer to a four-year institution; career-technical students in need of continuing education, career advancement or entrepreneurial application; as well as individual taxpayers.

The committee agreed to approve ACCT 032X4 as a new course.

- **CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** Principles and procedures of federal and state income taxation. Introduction to history and objectives of taxation, tax concepts and laws, current-year tax code and tax planning. Preparation of tax returns, emphasizing the individual taxpayer. Volunteer tax assistance is required. This course may be taken four times.
- **SCHEDULE DESCRIPTION:** Principles and procedures of federal and state income taxation. Preparation of tax returns, emphasizing the individual taxpayer. Volunteer tax assistance is required.

NOTE: Course will equate with ACCT 030 at SBVC

B. ENGL 010 Preparation for College English

A significant percentage of CHC students score within the developmental range on reading and writing placement tests. A sequence of courses in development reading and writing are needed to assist underprepared students to acquire needed proficiency as they prepare for college-level coursework.

The committee agreed to approve ENGL 010 as a new course. The prerequisite of READ 980 and ENGL 976 or eligibility for ENGL 010 as determined by the Crafton Hills College assessment process were also approved.

- **COURSE TITLE:** Preparation of College English
- **SEMESTER UNITS:** 4
- **SEMESTER HOURS:** **LECTURE:** 64 – 72
- **PREREQUISITE:** READ 980 and ENGL 976 or eligibility for ENGL 010 as determined by the Crafton Hills College assessment process
- **COREQUISITE:** None
- **DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:** None
- **CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** Instruction in the essential skills necessary for college-level reading and effective expository writing. Replaces ENGL 015.
- **SCHEDULE DESCRIPTION:** Instruction in the essential skills necessary for college-level reading and effective expository writing. Replaces ENGL 015.

NOTE: Course will equate with ENGL 015 at SBVC

C. ENGL 976 Fundamentals of Writing

A significant percentage of CHC students score within the developmental range on reading and writing placement tests. A sequence of courses in development reading and writing are needed to assist underprepared

students to acquire needed proficiency as they prepare for college-level coursework.

The committee agreed to approve ENGL 976 as a new course. The corequisite of READ 980 was also approved.

- **COURSE TITLE:** Fundamentals of Writing
- **SEMESTER UNITS:** 4
- **SEMESTER HOURS:** **LECTURE:** 64 – 72
- **PREREQUISITE:** None
- **COREQUISITE:** READ 980
- **DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:** None
- **CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** Academic writing skills including critical thinking and associated reading skills expected in transfer and associate degree classes. Instruction focusing on writing effective paragraphs and short compositions, including framing topic sentences and developing and supporting thesis statements. Emphasis on English grammar and critical reading and critical thinking skills as a foundation for effective writing. Replaces ENGL 914.
- **SCHEDULE DESCRIPTION:** Development of academic writing, critical thinking, and corresponding reading skills expected in associate degree and transfer-level courses. Instruction focusing on skills required for vocabulary development, critical writing, fluency, and understanding the relationship between writing and reading. Replaces ENGL 914.

NOTE: This course does not equate with SBVC

D. READ 980 Fundamentals of Reading

A significant percentage of CHC students score within the developmental range on reading and writing placement tests. A sequence of courses in development reading and writing are needed to assist underprepared students to acquire needed proficiency as they prepare for college-level coursework.

The committee agreed to approve READ 980 as a new course. The corequisite of ENGL 976 was also approved.

- **CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** Development of academic reading, critical thinking, and corresponding writing skills expected in associate degree and transfer-level courses. Instruction focusing on skills required for vocabulary development, critical reading comprehension, fluency, and understanding the relationship between reading and writing. Replaces READ 956.
- **SCHEDULE DESCRIPTION:** Development of academic reading, critical thinking, and corresponding writing skills expected in associate degree and transfer-level courses. E. RELIG 113 Introduction to Eastern Religions

This course was originally taught at Crafton from 1977-1979. Since the content has change, the course is being submitted as a new course instead of a course modification. The course will introduce students to religious doctrines, myths and practices typical in non-western cultures.

The committee agreed to approve RELIG 113 as a new course.

- **CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** Introductory study of the religions of Asia, including Hinduism, Buddhism, Daoism, Confucianism, and Shinto. Overview of historical developments, doctrines, myths, practices, and ideological similarities among different religions.
- **SCHEDULE DESCRIPTION:** Introductory study of the religions of Asia, including Hinduism, Buddhism, Daoism, Confucianism, and Shinto.
