DAVIDOFF LEAVES AS CHC PRESIDENT

Crafton Hills College President Foster Davidoff has chosen to resign and has accepted the position of superintendent of the Riverside Community College District and president of Riverside Community College.

In his new position, President Davidoff will supervise the operation of the 12,000-student Riverside campus. He will replace Dr. Kenneth Harper, who will return to classroom teaching at RCC.

President Davidoff said he had "very mixed feelings" about the appointment, but said he had to consider the offer from a career viewpoint, "I have liked it here very much," he said,

"It's a beautiful town and community. It was a hard decision for me to make."

Foster Davidoff was hired as the CHC president in June of 1971 and was responsible for coordinating plans for operating the new college, forming the curriculum and interviewing applicants for about 40 faculty positions. He also has guided the college through major physical and philosophical changes smoothly.

Davidoff earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in English from Fresno State and did graduate work for his administrative credential at Cal State Long Beach, UCLA and USC.
