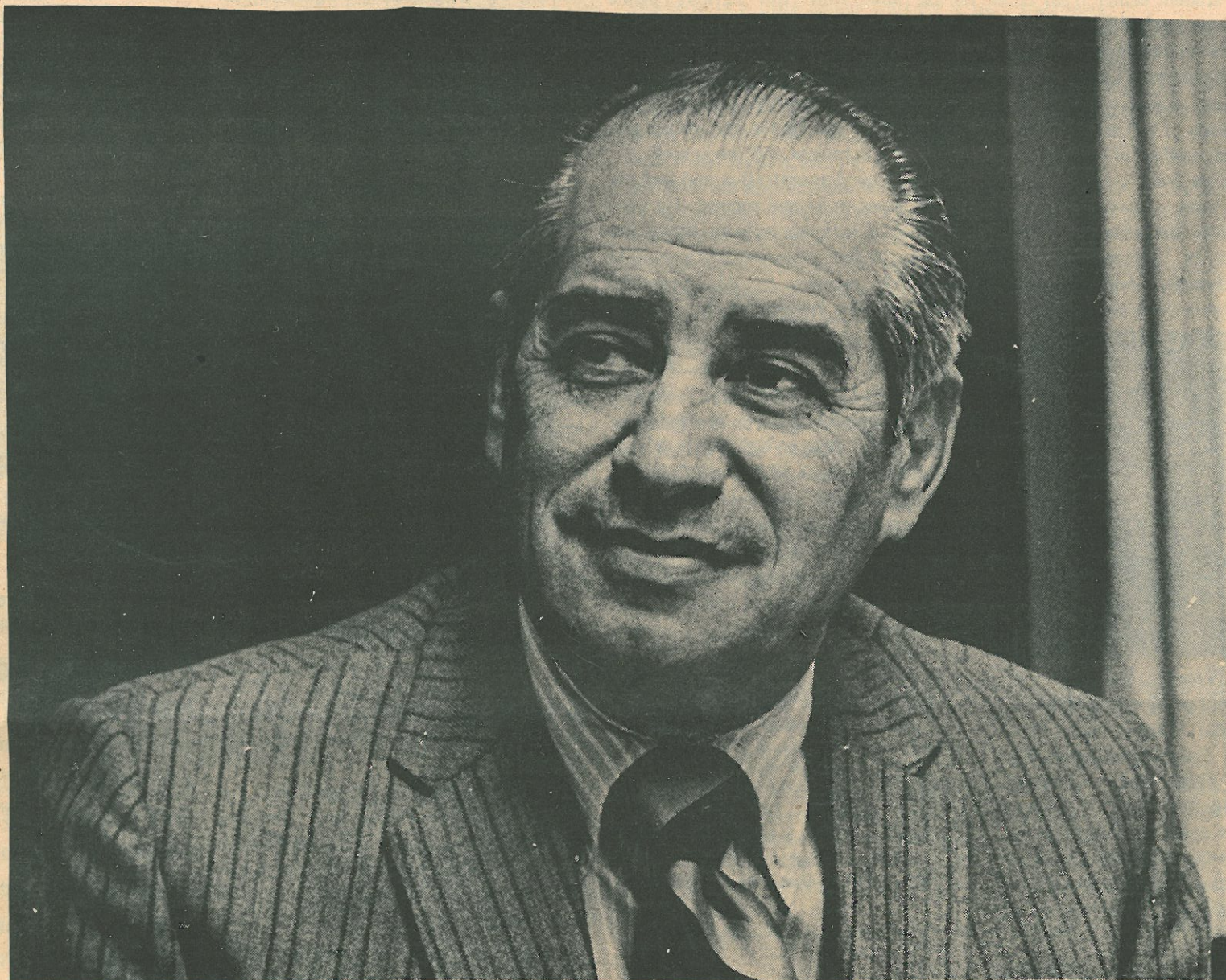

It combines an outstanding faculty and an intensely loyal and efficient staff. Students as well as staff have every opportunity to share in its life, to determine the nature of its existence, to shape its future." ## New President Interviewed

Roger C. Anton succeeds Foster Davidoff as President of CHC, beginning his office August first.

President Anton began his teaching career in 1940 and taught until 1943 when he joined the Navy. In 1946 he joined the Valley College faculty as a teacher of romance languages and taught until 1972 when he became Dean of Evening College and Summer Session.

President Anton is a firm believer, and practioner, of the "team approach". This his "Crafton Dream". He encourages everyone to work together.

"Crafton Hills", President Anton said, "was purposely designed to remain small so that students and faculty would frequently be involved together. This would be conducive to everyone working together".

Although, due to lack of funds, former plans to make Crafton Hills one of a cluster of three colleges will not be realized, the Crafton Dream is still uppermost on President Anton's list of goals.

"Life", he said, "is tough, but not with other people around to help".

President Anton is extremely supportive of students and will have an open-door policy.

There are two aspects of his job he doesn't like. One is the inevitable, and yet necessary, paperwork.

Speaking of the other, President Anton said, "I don't like being absent from the classroom—I miss teaching". He hopes to "sneak off" when things are calmer and teach just one class.

His interests? In President Anton's own words, "Living is everything"!
