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5 **BOARD OF TRUSTEES CODE OF ETHICS**
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8 A violation by any member of the Board of Trustees of Board Policy 2010 will result in
9 the following action:

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11 A. A written complaint may be filed by a member of the board of trustees, or any
12 other person to the president of the board of trustees. If the violation is by the
13 board president, the complaint shall be filed with the vice president. The
14 complaint must cite the section of the board ethics statement being violated.
15 B. The board president or vice president shall appoint a subcommittee to review the
16 charges and make a report and a recommendation back to the board of trustees
17 in an open meeting.
18 C. In the event that the violation involves "pending litigation" the board may discuss
19 the findings of the subcommittee in closed session. Any action on the
20 recommendation must be reported out and voted on in an open meeting.
21 D. The recommended actions by the subcommittee to the full board can include a
22 requirement to take ethics training as prescribed in AB 1234, a training session
23 on the Brown Act, censure by the board of trustees, or legal charges being filed
24 with the District Attorney against the violating member.
25 E. The action taken by the board will be binding on the board member charged and
26 on the board as a whole. The records of any actions identified in the
27 recommendation shall be maintained by the Office of the District Chancellor.
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
