

Background

- Chino Hills USD/Upland High School
- Rationale:
 - Students at risk of failing courses
 - Students needing to make up a failed course
 - Students wanting to get ahead
- Not a money maker!
- Any income generated split 50/50 with partnering high school

Structure



- Online and/or Face-to-Face
- 2 Weeks, 4.5 hours/day
- Instructor Rate: \$43.61/hour
- \$1,962.45/class

Student Fees

- 25 students, \$79 to break even.
- 20 students, \$99 to break even.
- 15 students, \$131 to break even.
- o students, \$196 to break even.

Responsibilities

HIGH SCHOOL

- Marketing
- Space
- Texts
- List of classes and faculty

SBCCD

- Handle registration
- Employ high school teachers as short-term employees
- Provide seed money for pilot

Request/Recommendations

- Target 4 summer high school classes with a projected enrollment of 20 students per class
- Cost per class \$100
- Need to establish maximum class size and enrollment deadline
- Scholarships provided to students to fill any vacant seats



CHC Recent High School Graduates Report

What's Included in the Report:

- Your 2011 High School Graduates Compared to All 2011 High School Graduates in Crafton's Primary Service Area (N = 25)
- First Semester Crafton Hills College Performance Outcomes for 2009 through 2011 Graduates <u>From</u> Your High School
- First Semester Crafton Hills College Performance Outcomes for 2009 through 2011 Graduates <u>From</u> <u>Primary Service Area High Schools</u>



Data and Information Contained in the Report:

- Demographic Information
- Educational Background Information
- Assessment Test Placement Recommendations
- Course-Taking Behavior
- Momentum Points (e.g.: Completing an Ed Plan)
- First Semester Performance Outcome Measures

Fall 2011 Demographic Data Observations:

- Similar proportion of females and males when compared to the Crafton Hills College Student Body Population
- More Caucasian Students represented among recent high school graduates from the 25 primary service area high schools
- Fewer Hispanic Students represented among recent high school graduates from the 25 primary service area high schools

Educational Background Data:

- Self-Reported Textbook Reading Skills
 - 28% reported that they understand what they have read the first time through
 - 60% reported that they need to read material more than once before they understand
- Self-Reported Attitude Toward Math
 - 35% like math
 - 55% don't like math or are scared by it, but believe that they can probably pass a math class if they give a good effort

Assessment Placement Recommendations:

- 31% of students assess into Freshmen Composition
- 42% assess into college academic reading
- 10% assess into college algebra or higher
- Largest Percentage of Students Place:
 - One level below Freshmen Composition (38%)
 - College Academic Reading (42%)
 - One level below college algebra (49%)


Student Behavior Related to Course Success:

 Students who enroll in 12 or more units are statistically significantly more likely to successfully complete their courses




Student Behavior Related to Course Success:

 Students who enroll an English course their first semester at Crafton are statistically significantly more likely to successfully complete their courses



Student Behavior Related to Course Success:

 Students who successfully complete a developmental education (DE) course their first semester at Crafton are statistically significantly more likely to successfully complete their other courses
