



Crafton Hills College Fall 2012 Left Lane Student Outcomes







Percent of Students Successfully Completing English and Math One Level Below Transfer



Left Lane students were substantially and statistically significantly more likely to enroll in a math course (89%) than students in the comparison group (34%).


Left Lane students were substantially and statistically significantly more likely to enroll in an English course (77%) than students in the comparison group (26%).


African American Left Lane students were substantially (ES = .77) and statistically significantly (p < .001) more likely to successfully complete their Fall 2012 courses (81%) than non-Left Lane African American students (45%).

Left Lane students were substantially and statistically significantly more likely to successfully complete English (82% to 69%) and math (64% to 51%) courses than students in the comparison group.

Left Lane students were substantially more likely to successfully complete ENGL-015 (81% to 72%) and MATH-095 (69% to 57%) than the comparison group.


Left Lane students who earned a GOR in English and math in Fall 2012 were substantially and statistically significantly more likely to enroll in an English course (65% to 46%) and math course (56% to 43%) in Spring 2013 than the comparison group.

Note: Fall 2012 was the first term in which the Left Lane Project (LLP) was implemented. The Left Lane Project initially started with 276 students, 258 (93%) earned a grade on record (GOR) in Fall 2012. The purpose of the LLP is to reduce the amount of time it takes students to earn an AA/AS Degree at Crafton. To accomplish this LLP has implemented numerous strategies specifically geared toward first-time college students: Summer Bridge Program, learning communities, supplemental instruction, counseling and tutoring services, and services provided through SOA³R.
