Research Briefs from the Office of Institutional Research Day and Evening Students by Full-Time and Part-time Status and Fall Term from 2006 to 2010

Purpose: The purpose of this brief is to illustrate the percent of Crafton students who attend day classes only, evening classes only, and both day and evening courses by full and part-time status.

Methodology: Day sections are sections that have a start time prior to 4:00PM, and evening sections have a start time at 4:00PM or later. Part-time students were enrolled in less than 12 units and full-time students were enrolled in 12 or more units.

Findings: Overall, approximately 40% of students enrolled in day only sections, 18% in evening only sections, and 41% in both day and evening sections. In Fall 2010, 40% of students enrolled in day only sections and 43% enrolled in both day and evening sections.

Table 2 illustrates the number and percent of students enrolled in both day and evening sections by the number of day and evening sections. Overall, 46% of Crafton students were enrolled in one evening section and two or more day sections. In addition, 38% of Crafton students were enrolled in two or more of both day and evening sections.

Tables 3 and 4 illustrate the number and percent of full and part-time students by the time of day they are most likely to enroll in classes. Full-time students were more likely to enroll both day and evening sections (58%), followed by day only sections (38%). On the other hand, part-time students were more likely to enroll in day only sections (40%), followed by day and evening sections (34%). In addition, part-time students were more likely to only enroll in sections during the evening (24%) than full-time students (3%).
