Number and Percent of 2012-2013 Degree and Certificate Earners who Transferred In Units from Another College

Purpose of Brief

The purpose of this brief is to illustrate the number and percent of degrees and/or certificates earned that may have included work from another college during the 2012-2013 academic year.

Summary of Findings

- 26% (n = 168) of the degrees and certificates earned in 2012-2013 may have included transferred in work from another college
- 22% (n = 161) of the degrees and certificates earned in 2012-2013 may have included transferred in work from another college for a degree
- 4% (n = 27) of the degrees and certificates earned in 2012-2013 may have included transferred in work from another college for a certificate

Overview


Crafton Hills College is currently in the process of developing a fully functional degree audit and student educational planning module. To help inform the transition to a fully functioning degree audit and student educational planning system, the Admissions and Records Office requested information on the number of students who earned a degree and/or certificate in 2012 – 2013 and who transferred in work from another college.

Methodology

Students that had transferred in work were identified in one of three ways. First, if students had the following pneumonic in the term field in the STUDENT.ACAD.CRED file they were identified as having transferred in work from another college: TRANSFWK. Second, if students had a code of ADVPLMT (i.e. Advanced Placement) they earned AP Credit in high school. Third, similar to AP Credit, students can also receive CLEP credit, usually by testing outside of high school and scoring at a certain level. Students who had completed any of this work were merged into the degree and certificate database to identify the number and percent of students who transferred in or completed work at another school or college and earned a degree and/or certificate. A limitation to this data is that whether or not the units applied to the degree and/or certificate earned was not determined. Conducting a study to identify how the units were applied to each degree and/or certificate would require approximately six months of additional time.

Findings

In 2012-2013 647 students earned 731 degrees and certificates. Of the 731 degrees and certificates earned in 2012-2013, 168 (25.7%) were earned by students who had transferred in units from another college. Of the 731 records where students transferred in work, 22% (n = 161) were for students who had earned a degree and 4% (n = 27) were four students who had earned a certificate.



Note: The percent of total transfer-in credit combines the certificate and degree transfer-in credit.

Table 1 illustrates the number of records and the number of units transferred to Crafton by college for the top 20 institutions from 1999 – 2014. The results indicate that students are most likely to transfer in units from SBVC, followed by RCC, CSUSB, Chaffey, and Mt. San Jacinto College. Table 2 shows the top 5 colleges that units were transferred in for students who earned a degree and/or certificate in 2012-2013. Students were much more likely to transfer in work from SBVC than any other college.
