The committee agreed that the draft process for proposing new programs in its current form did not need to be changed at this time. The committee also decided to not move the draft process for creating new programs forward until the Crafton Council decides on a process for proposing new grants because the committee was not sure that the two processes could be separated and rather than creating two similar processes they decided to wait until Crafton Council proposes a process for grants.
