COURSE MODIFICATIONS

A. ASL 101 American Sign Language I

The textbooks and course objectives were updated.

The committee agreed to approve ASL 101 as a six-year revision.

The course will equate with ASL 109 at SBVC.

• NEW DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION: Eligibility for ENGL 101

B. ASL 102 American Sign Language II

The textbooks and course objectives were updated.

The committee agreed to approve ASL 102 as a six-year revision. The prerequisite of ASL 101 was also approved.

The course will equate with ASL 110 at SBVC.

- NEW DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION: Eligibility for ENGL 101
- NEW CATALOG DESCRIPTION: Continuing introduction to American Sign Language as used by the deaf community in the United States. Study of a more advanced vocabulary of approximately 400 additional signs, ASL sentence structures and social conventions involved in ASL. Discussion of the history of deaf education and the deaf community through present times as well as effect of technological developments upon the deaf community and deaf individuals. NOTE: This course corresponds to the second year of high school American Sign Language.

F. PSYCH 113 Adulthood and Old Age

The department does not plan to offer the course since it does not meet the requirements for the state transfer model.

The committee agreed to approve the deletion of PSYCH 113 from the college catalog.

G. PSYCH 116 Psychology of Gender Roles

The concern of the committee is that PSYCH 116 is the only course at Crafton that looks at gender. Currently the course transfers to UC and CSU, if the course is deleted and then ask to be resurrected in a few years, the course will have to go through the articulation process which takes two years. The course was last taught in 2009. The course was tabled.

H. PSYCH 117 Computer Applications in Research

The department does not plan to offer the course since it does not meet the requirements for the state transfer model. The course that was crosslisted will continue to be offered as MATH 117. MATH 117 will need to be updated to reflect the change.

The committee agreed to approve the deletion of PSYCH 117 from the college catalog

PSYCH 121 Forensic Psychology

The department does not plan to offer the course since it does not meet the requirements for the state transfer model.

The committee agreed to approve the deletion of PSYCH 121 from the college catalog.

I. PSYCH 127X2 Emergency Management: Decision Making and Problem Solving The department does not plan to offer the course since it does not meet the requirements for the state transfer model. The course that was crosslisted will continue to be offered as PBSF 127X2. PBSF 127X2 will need to be updated to reflect the change.

The committee agreed to approve the deletion of PSYCH 127X2 from the college catalog.

J. PSYCH 132 Counseling and Interviewing Techniques

Since the course has somewhat been replaced by CHC 100 Student Success and the College Experience, the department does not see a need for the course.
