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Research Briefs from the Office of Institutional Research Honors Students


Purpose: The purpose of this brief is to examine the number of Crafton students participating in the Honors program from Fall 2008 to Spring 2010.

Methodology: Honors students were identified by identifying the courses in Datatel at Crafton that had an "H" designating the course as an Honors course. A limitation to the data presented here is that the numbers do not include students who have participated in the Honors program through individual contracts with instructors.

Findings: From Fall 2008 to Spring 2010, 209 students expressed interest in an Honors course by either enrolling and dropping a stand-alone Honors course or by enrolling in and earning a grade on record (i.e. A, B, C, D, F, NP, NC, P, CR, I, or W) in a stand-alone Honors course. In Fall 2008, Spring 2009, and Fall 2009 64 students expressed an interest in a stand-alone Honors course by enrolling in the Honors course. At the same time, 36 (56%) earned a grade on record (GOR) and 25 of the 36 (69.4%) successfully (A, B, C, or P) completed the Honors course.

In Spring 2010, as of January 7, 2010 67 students were enrolled in six Honors courses (GEOG-110H, GEOL-100H, PHIL-105H, PSYCH-100H, SPEECH-100H and 111H). Five of the 67 students currently enrolled in an Honors course were also enrolled in two Honors standalone courses. In total, 103 students have either completed an Honors stand-alone-course or are currently enrolled in a Spring 2010 Honors course. At the same time, there are 92 Honors students who successfully completed an Honors stand-alone course and who are currently enrolled in a Spring 2010 Honors.

The number of enrollments in Honors courses has increased from 5 in Fall 2008 to 67 in Spring 2010, a 124% increase. In addition, the number of grades on record has increased from 4 in Fall 2008 to 17 in Fall 2009, a 175% increase, and the number of successful grades has increase from 2 in Fall 2008 to 10 in Fall 2009, a 400% increase.
