Research Briefs from the Office of Institutional Research ACCT-208 Success, Retention, and Successful Persistence to ACCT-209

Purpose: The purpose of this brief is to illustrate the success and retention of ACCT-208 (Introduction to Financial Accounting) from 2007 – 2008 to 2009 – 2010. In addition, CHC student successful persistence from ACCT-208 to ACCT-209 (Introduction to Managerial Accounting) was also examined.

Methodology: Grades on record (GOR) refer to one of the following grades: A, B, C, D, F, P, NP, I, or W. Success rate is a grade of A, B, C, or P divided by the number of GOR. Retention is the number of A, B, C, D, F, P, NP, or I grades divided by the number of GOR. Successful persistence rate tracks the number of students who successfully completed ACCT-208 and ACCT-209.

Findings: Tables 1 and 2 illustrate the success and retention rates of ACCT-208 students as well as the successful persistence rate of students successfully completing ACCT-208 and ACCT-209. The overall success rate from 2007 – 2008 to 2009 – 2010 in ACCT-208 was 59.3%. The success rate in ACCT-208 has decreased from 62.7% in 2007 – 2008 to 58.5% 2009 – 2010. In addition, 285 students have successfully completed ACCT-208 in the last three years. Overall, 41.1% or 117 of the 285 students have successfully completed both ACCT-208 and ACCT-209.

Note: "% Success in ACCT-209" is the number of successful grades earned in ACCT-209 divided by the number of students who successfully completed ACCT-208 (e.g.: 44 / 99 = 44.4%).
