Major goals this year: Dialogue, Promotion, Timeline, Documentation, ILO's	The group discussed their major goals for the year. While progress has bee made, there is still much to do to reach proficiency by December, 2012. Rebeccah distributed Gary's report on Instructional learning outcomes. The report shows of 372 total courses offered in the previous 2 years, excluding catalog courses not yet offered and new courses not yet offered, 87% of have SLOs, 68% have an assessment method, 52% have been assessed, and 42% have completed a cycle.	
Dialogue: Review of Professional Development Schedule, 2011- 2012 and identification of gaps	The group reviewed the 2011-2012 schedule. There are many SLO and Assessment workshops offered this year. No changes were recommended. There are several workshops offered on September 14, flex day. Gary will set aside time to workshop SLOs and assessment with faculty. In addition, Cheryl and Rebeccah will present the proposed ILO assessment model.
