

Become a Grant Reviewer!

Serving as a grant proposal review panelist is an excellent way to learn about the grant process, become familiar with a particular grant program and/or funding agency, learn about innovations in your area of interest, and network with colleagues and funding agency representatives in your field. Review panel service is one of the single best ways to prepare yourself to develop a grant proposal.

Please let the Grants Office know if you apply to serve on any grant proposal review committees and if you are selected to review proposals!

Most federal agencies rely heavily on subject matter experts to review and advise them on which proposals should be funded. Agencies are always seeking to enrich their rosters of potential review panelists, and many federal agencies now provide information on-line about how to become a review panelist.
