

REGISTRATION & ENROLLMENT CHANGES



1. Priority Registration—Beginning Spring 2014

In order to be eligible for priority registration, all students must complete the student success process (CHC application, orientation, and assessment.)

 ONLY units completed or currently enrolled at CHC will be used to calculate priority registration level.

Priority	Categories
А	Students who've been accepted into the EOPS, DSP&S or CalWorks programs, are active military/veterans or current/former Foster Youth.
В	Continuing students who have completed 45 to 90 units at CHC. Students accepted into the Left Lane, or S.T.E.M. programs.
С	Continuing Students who have completed 30 to 44.9 units at CHC.
D	Continuing students who have completed 15 to 29.9 units at CHC.
Е	Continuing students who have completed 0 to 14.9 units at CHC.
F	New students who have completed the student success process (CHC application, orientation, and assessment) or met the preenrollment assessment waiver criteria prior to the registration date for Priority F.
Open	 All students in the above listed priorities as well as: New students who have not completed the student success process. Returning students who have not attended the immediately preceding semester. High School students who have been approved for Concurrent Enrollment to attend courses.

EXCEPTIONS: The following groups of students do not qualify for priority registration.

- Students who have previously earned a Bachelor's degree or higher
- Students who have completed 100 or more combined units within the San Bernardino Community College District
- Students who have been on academic or progress probation for the two immediately preceding terms

Beginning Spring 2014, students will have to maintain at least a 2.0 GPA to keep their Priority Enrollment.

Students may appeal their Priority Category.

2. 90/100 Unit Limit

Students who have accumulated 90 units at Crafton Hills College or 100 units between CHC and San Bernardino Valley College are not eligible for Priority Registration. Specific high-unit majors or programs may be exempt; e.g., Respiratory Care.

3. Course Repetitions

Students can only repeat a course **two** times, for a total of three attempts, between Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College.

Withdrawals count toward that limit. (As always, there may be some exceptions.)

4. Financial Aid

Expect stricter financial aid requirements in the future (Fall 2016). The BOG Waiver may require a 2.0 GPA, which means grades will need to be verified before awards are issued each semester.
