

Submit your Application



- Visit craftonhills.edu and click "Apply Now"
- Complete and submit your application for the correct term
- After submitting, you'll receive a welcome email to your personal email you provided in the admissions application. Allow 1–2 hours for processing
 - Tip: Make sure you apply for the term in which you wish to start taking classes



How to Apply:

- 1. Complete the <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>CADAA Dream</u> Application (Crafton Hills School Code: **009272**)
- 2. Log into Self-Service to view your financial aid status.
- 3. Once CADAA Dream Application has been processed, email financialaid@craftonhills.edu to open your file

California Promise Grant

- Covers full enrollment fees (\$46/unit) for eligible California residents attending community college.
- Not a cash award covers tuition only; other fees still apply.
- Apply each academic year (covers Fall, Spring & Summer).
- Apply through the FAFSA or California Dream Act Application (for AB 540 students).

What Is Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)?

To remain eligible for financial aid at Crafton Hills College, you must meet three SAP standards:

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Complete at least 67% of units attempted
- Finish your program within 150% of the required units



Health and Wellness



Health and Wellness

The Health & Wellness Center provides students with care for wellness, illness, and injury. Student health services are available to all registered students who pay the health fee. Students pay small additional fees for some services. Services include:

- Emotional and Mental Health
- Alcoholism and Addiction
- Reproductive Health

Opioid Overdose Prevention Resources

Educational materials from the State Department of Public Health are available, including information on naloxone (opioid-reversal medication) and safe practices. Free Narcan (Naloxone) and <u>Fentanyl test strips</u> are available to students at the Health and Wellness Center per the Campus Opioid Safety Act, California Legislation <u>SB 367</u>

Sexual Violence & Harassment Prevention

Sexual Harassment Reporting & Response– Title IX

- When harassment is reported, the Title IX Coordinator explains both informal and formal options, including the grievance process
- The college investigates all reports, even if the victim doesn't file a formal complaint. Investigations are **prompt, thorough, and impartial**, and the complainant is kept informed
- Identities are kept confidential as much as possible during investigations. If a student requests to stay anonymous, the college will honor this when possible, while still taking steps to address and prevent harassment

Your Rights & Responsibilities

- San Bernardino Community College District does not discriminate on the basis of age, color, creed, religion, disability, marital status, veteran status, national origin, race, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression
- <u>Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act</u> (FERPA) The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords students certain rights with respect to their education records
- <u>Student Grievance Procedure</u>: If you feel you have been treated unfairly, you have a right to complain. To ensure that your grievance receives a reasonable hearing, refer to <u>SBCCD Board Policy</u> and <u>Administrative Procedure 5530</u>
- Standards of Student Conduct and Disciplinary Procedures: Students enrolled in the San Bernardino Community College District shall refrain from disruptive conduct which significantly interferes with the instructional program, college activities, or which endangers the health or safety of members of the college, including visitors to the campus. Disruptive conduct on the part of students shall be cause for disciplinary action in accordance with policies adopted by the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees and pursuant to appropriate sections of the Education Code, the Business and Professions Code, the Health and Safety Code, and the Penal Code of California
