The Redlands Emergency Services Academy (RESA) completed its eleventh year in July with 19 cadets completing the 8-day program. During their time at RESA, cadets experiencing a variety of police and fire exercises with professionals in those fields.

Of the 19 cadets that completed the program, most are interested in careers in fire service. Thirteen are currently registered at CHC, one is attending SBVC, three are starting their college careers this Fall at fouryear universities and two others are joining the Armed Services.

RESA is a free experience for the students made possible

through a grant from the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians, Crafton Hills College, University of Redlands and the City of Redlands Police and Fire Departments.



Paramedic Students Graduate With 14,516 Hours of Experience

Nineteen students received Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Certificates at the 73rd CHC Paramedic Graduation Ceremony on July 9, 2010.

Graduates were required to complete a comprehensive program entailing emergency medical care, learning skills to handle trauma situations, cardiac problems, respiratory problems, delivering babies, emergency care for children and 164 hours of clinical and 600 hours of field externships totaling 14,516 hours between the entire graduating class.
