CHC Partnership With Local Hospital Generates New Professionals

Twelve students recently graduated from the Arrowhead Regional Medical Center's School of Radiologic Technology which offers a complete two-year hospital-based program with the County of San Bernardino and Crafton Hills College.

The certificate program accepts only 12 students each year in the only hospital-based program of its kind in the area to be affiliated with a community college. A field that is suffering from a nationwide shortage of trained professionals, radiologic technologists are medical imaging professionals who assist with the diagnosis and treatment of illness and disease by performing x-ray studies.



The program is unique because of the extensive amount of clinical experience students receive. Students spend 40 hours each week in the program including three days of clinical work and two days of professional classes.

Six of the 12 graduates took their board exams and all passed. About 98% of the graduates from the program remain in the Inland Empire.

Construction Projects Nearing Completion



At the Aquatic Center (CRF), May and June brought attention to final punch list items, LEED work on the HVAC system and photovoltaic and solar water heating arrays being finalized by the architect. Health Department inspection was scheduled to occur in June.
