CHC Fire Academy Students Help 'Fill the Boot' at NASCAR

Thanks to Firefighters from throughout the Inland Empire, NASCAR fans "Filled-the-Boot" generously at the Auto Club Speedway in Fontana to support the Burn Institute-Inland Empire (BI-IE). Firefighters and cadets greeted the enthusiastic race fans as they viewed the cars and got autographs from the drivers at NASCAR Fan Night on Oct. 7. The collaborative effort of the BI-IE and the AAA Speedway Foundation raises funds for BI-IE's 'Camp Beyond The Scars' set for February in Big Bear.

Among those volunteering were approximately 30 CHC pre-Fire Academy students. Instructor and BI-

IE Board Member Terry Koeper, a professor of Fire Science, wanted the students to learn that becoming Firefighters carries with it a sense of responsibility to others. "We've been supporting the programs of the BI-IE for many years," said Koeper, "and there's nothing more meaningful than helping send burn-injured children to the burn camp."

The volunteers were back at the Speedway for NASCAR's fourth Sprint Cup Series Chase; and again for the final NASCAR Sprint Cup race of the fall season, ultimately collecting \$5,125 in donations. "Because of our local NASCAR fans, a lot of deserving kids will be able to go to camp in February."
