Abstract Art Exhibit is Partnership with IEMA

For the first time ever, Crafton Hills College is showcasing abstract art pieces from the Inland Empire Museum of Art's permanent collection, featuring work by 24 Southern California artists.

"From Abstraction to Minimalism" is a survey of modernist ideas, and the goal is to "expand understanding" of abstract art, Crafton Hills College student and co-curator Yadira Dockstader said.

"The artworks cover a period from 1960 to today," Dockstader said. "The work presented is an exploration of mediums via shapes and forms within a composition. A spectator could see a progression of ideas and how the figuration gets into the abstraction."

"This is a great opportunity to create an exhibition that highlights abstraction and mini-malism through local artists from the Inland Empire Museum of Art's collection," Dockstader said.

The exhibition will run in the Crafton Hills College Art Gallery September 21 through October 19, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Master Student Waheed Zahir

Had a friend not encouraged him to enroll in community college, Waheed "Z" Zahir wouldn't be where he is today — preparing to attend medical school, his sights set on becoming a board-certified neurosurgeon.

Zahir enrolled at Crafton Hills College in fall 2015, and is now a Master Student, working with his peers to offer support and advice as they strive to be successful learners.

A Master Student is a student who has completed at least two semesters at Crafton Hills College with a 3.0 GPA. The role of the Master Student is to assist prospective new and first semester students learn the ins and outs of being a successful student at Crafton. They can connect with other students from the "student perspective" as they know the college systems better than most because they access them on a regular basis.



"In my opinion, going to school is one of the best things you can do for yourself, the people around you, and for society in general," he said. "Arrogance and ignorance runs deep, especially with our current societal and political atmosphere, and I believe education can help remedy many of these problems.

As someone who originally had no interest in going to college, Zahir comes into the Master Student role with a different perspective.

"If I can help and encourage anyone else to pursue academics, I'll be satisfied," he said. "It was Ralph Waldo Emerson who said, 'To know that even one life has taken a breath easier because I have lived, is also to have succeeded."

Zahir thinks that having Master Students is "great for the simple fact that it makes the whole process of applying and attending Crafton easier for new students. I've had prospective students ask for my personal experience in classes as well as the campus in general, and I think that help other students make an informed decision. My hope is that the program will eventually be expanded; I think it's a great service provided by Crafton."

Scholarship Recipients Connect with Benefactors

The CHC Foundation connected students scholars with their scholarship benefactors at a special reception on Thursday, August 31. Two students shared their Crafton stories and how the scholarships they were awarded made a difference in their educational journeys.
