

The findings in this report stem from the Professional Development (PD) presenter evaluations provided during the spring 2021term's In-Service day in April. A total of 5 <u>valid</u> online evaluations were received and analyzed. There was a total of 14 workshops offered with a combined total of 20 presenters.

The purpose of the evaluation was to improve future PD workshops based on the presenter's experience facilitating the workshop. A major limitation to consider is the low number of evaluations analyzed. Based on responses received, the purpose of the evaluation was unclear (e.g., feedback offered from an attendee's perspective instead of the workshop presenter).

Table I represents the overall evaluation of all workshops. One hundred percent of responses provided indicated agreement or strong agreement with the following statements:

- The platform (i.e., Zoom) for this workshop was appropriate.
- The technology used for this workshop was functional.
- I received sufficient support from the Professional Development Committee for this workshop.
