## 2023-2024 INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC)

<b>MET / IP / NEED</b>	<p>Completion <i>and</i> certification of IGETC will permit a student to transfer from Crafton Hills College to a campus in the UC or CSU system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. <b>All courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or better.</b></p> <p><b>CERTIFICATION:</b> Current IGETC standards allow for <b>full or partial certification</b>. Partial certification is defined as completing all but two courses from any area <b>except those listed in Areas 1 and 2</b>. Students should request <b>IGETC certification</b> with Admissions &amp; Records when requesting their final transcripts to be sent to the UC or CSU campus of their choice during the final term before transfer. <b>NOTE for any students who begin at a California community college prior to Fall 2025:</b> Students may present an IGETC certification beginning with the version current to when they began at a California Community College.</p> <p><b>CAUTION:</b> IGETC may not be the best option for transfer, particularly for majors such as <b>Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, Engineering and Math</b>. - 6D** Formal schooling at the sixth grade level or higher where the language of instruction was not English
- 6E** Complete **one** of the following courses at Crafton Hills College: ASL 101(F21), 102, 103, 104, 105; JAPN 102, 103, 104; SPAN 102, 103, 104
