Vote for me for VP!A!

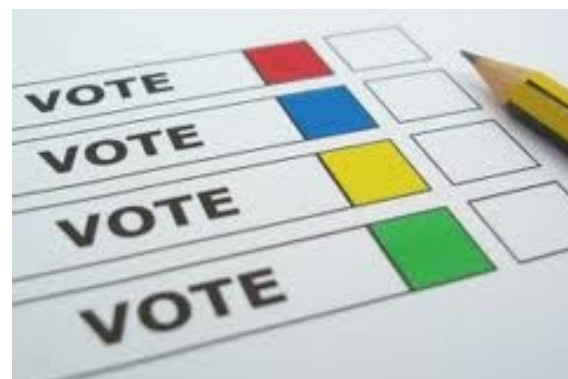


Audrey Ramsaran for Secretary
