To graduate from our bachelor's degree programs, you are required to have a certain number of credits in General Education disciplines. Since our students join our programs with different educational histories, we offer flexible requirements and a large variety of options to fulfill them.

What is the General Education Requirement?

Students in the University of Redlands School of Business must complete 120 units of semester academic credit with a minimum 2.0 GPA to earn their bachelor's degree. These must include 42 semester credits of General Education. A minimum of 9 of these credits must be earned at the upper-division level. No course can fulfill more than one subject area requirement. You will be assigned a Student Services Manager (SSM) to help you develop a plan to meet these requirements and complete your degree. On the left, you will find examples of areas of transfer credits.

CSU and UC Track Courses

The University of Redlands generally accepts courses in transfer that are transferable to the California State University and University of California systems with a few exceptions (i.e. culinary arts, hospitality services, auto mechanics, cosmetology, welding, air conditioning, clothing construction, and aircraft maintenance technology). The following disciplines are reviewed with faculty for potential transfer credit on a case-by-case basis: fire technology, radiography, library science, transportation, legal assistant/paralegal, machine shop, fashion design, water supply engineering, water technology education, wastewater technology education, work experience, animal health technology, and agriculture. Additional disciplines that are not similar to University of Redlands course offerings will also be reviewed with faculty as deemed appropriate. Course offerings that are accepted in transfer and are also referenced on the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will generally satisfy either degree or general education requirements at the University of Redlands. Please contact one of our eight locations throughout Southern California for assistance with questions regarding the articulation of courses to satisfy transfer and general education requirements for our undergraduate School of Business program offerings.

How can the General Education Requirement be fulfilled?

General Education credits may be obtained in a number of ways:

- Complete non-core courses offered through the School of Business or School of Continuing Studies.
- Submit assessment of prior and experiential learning through HUMB 310: Experiential Learning Course.
- Transfer credits from other institutions.
- Submit assessment of ACE-evaluated and professional/certificated learning.
- Submit passing CLEP and DSST scores (24 unit maximum combined)
- Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) (32 unit maximum combined)

Financial Aid

You need to complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) on the Web by visiting the U.S. Department of Education website: www.fafsa.ed.gov. The program guides you carefully through each step so you don't make a mistake. Although this application is not complicated, it can be tedious and we recommend you find an hour of solitude, read the instructions first, and then proceed. You will need your previous year's tax forms available for some of the answers.

Eligibility for financial aid is established for a one-year period and must be renewed for the following year. You will be required to complete a new FAFSA each year you attend University of Redlands classes. You may want to set a calendar reminder to complete your renewal form about 9 months after your first class begins. You must take the initiative to ensure timely submission of your renewal application and allow ample time for response by our Office of Financial Aid in preparing your financial aid prior to your next academic year.
