76	76370. The governing board of a community college district may
77	authorize a person to audit a community college course and may charge
78	that person a fee pursuant to this section.
79	(a) If a fee for auditing is charged, it shall not exceed fifteen
80	dollars (\$15) per unit per semester.
81	The governing board shall proportionately adjust the amount of the
82	fee for term lengths based upon a quarter system or other alternative
83	system approved pursuant to regulations of the board of governors, and
84	shall also proportionately adjust the amount of the fee for summer
85	sessions, intersessions, and other short-term courses.
86	In making these adjustments, the governing board may round the per
