Matters identified by Title 5 as standards of scholarship are grading practices, creditnoncredit options, credit by examination, standards for probation and dismissal, remedial course work, academic record symbols, grade changes, course repetition, and academic renewal. Authority and responsibility is delegated to the chief instructional or academic officer and the Academic Senate as described in the policies and procedures on participation in local decision-making.

23 Sample 1 from another District:

The District requires that all students maintain an acceptable level of progress toward
 their educational goals through course completion and by maintaining a minimum grade
 point average of 2.0 or higher. Students who do not maintain satisfactory progress
 toward their educational goal are subject to academic and/or progress probation and
 dismissal as outlined in the Administrative Procedures, in accordance with Title 5.

Matters identified by Title 5 as standards of scholarship are grading practices, creditnoncredit options, credit by examination, standards for probation and dismissal, remedial course work, academic record symbols, grade changes, course repetition, and academic renewal. Authority and responsibility is delegated to the Chief Instructional Officer and the Academic Senate as described in the policies and procedures on participation in local decision-making.

50	The District relies on the expertise of faculty for standards of scholarship. The						
51	Curriculum Committee of the Academic Senate is charged with maintaining the integrity						
52	and quality of the District curriculum, including appropriate breadth, depth, rigor,						
53	sequencing, pace, and synthesis of learning in courses and programs. The course						
54	development process, which culminates in approval by the Curriculum Committee,						
55	Academic Senate, and Board of Trustees, includes review of Student Learning						
56	Outcomes, how learning is assessed, and award of credit. Grading practices are						
57	consistent with Title 5 regulations. These practices are to be adhered to by faculty who						
58	administer grades. All of these procedures are described in the college catalog and/or						
59	schedule of classes.

The governing board of each community college district shall establish, maintain, operate, and govern one or more community colleges in accordance with law. In so doing, the governing board may initiate and carry on any program, activity, or may otherwise act in any manner that is not in conflict with or inconsistent with, or preempted by, any law and that is not in conflict with the purposes for which community college districts are established.				
3 4 5 6	(2) The governing board of each community college district shall establish rules and regulations not inconsistent with the regulations of the board of governors and the laws of this state for the government and operation of one or more community colleges in the district.				
7 8	(b) In furtherance of subdivision (a), the governing board of each community college district shall do all of the following:				
9 0 1 2 3 4	(1) Establish policies for, and approve, current and long-range academic and facilities plans and programs and promote orderly growth and development of the community colleges within the district. In so doing, the governing board shall, as required by law, establish policies for, develop, and approve, comprehensive plans. The governing board shall submit the comprehensive plans to the board of governors for review and approval.				
5 6	(2) Establish policies for and approve courses of instruction and educational programs. The educational programs shall be submitted to the board of				

- 107 governors for approval. Courses of instruction that are not offered in approved
- 108 educational programs shall be submitted to the board of governors for approval.
- 109 The governing board shall establish policies for, and approve, individual courses
- 110 that are offered in approved educational programs, without referral to the board
- 111 of governors.
- (3) Establish academic standards, probation and dismissal and readmission
- policies, and graduation requirements not inconsistent with the minimum standards adopted by the board of governors
- standards adopted by the board of governors.
- (4) Employ and assign all personnel not inconsistent with the minimumstandards adopted by the board of governors and establish employment
- practices, salaries, and benefits for all employees not inconsistent with the laws
 of this state.
- (5) To the extent authorized by law, determine and control the district's
- 120 operational and capital outlay budgets. The district governing board shall
- 121 determine the need for elections for override tax levies and bond measures and
- 122 request that those elections be called.
- (6) Manage and control district property. The governing board may contract forthe procurement of goods and services as authorized by law.
- 125 (7) Establish procedures that are consistent with minimum standards
- established by the board of governors to ensure faculty, staff, and students the
- 127 opportunity to express their opinions at the campus level, to ensure that these
- opinions are given every reasonable consideration, to ensure the right to
- 129 participate effectively in district and college governance, and to ensure the right
- 130 of academic senates to assume primary responsibility for making
- 131 recommendations in the areas of curriculum and academic standards.
- 132 (8) Establish rules and regulations governing student conduct.
- (9) Establish student fees as it is required to establish by law, and, in itsdiscretion, fees as it is authorized to establish by law.
- (10) In its discretion, receive and administer gifts, grants, and scholarships.
- (11) Provide auxiliary services as deemed necessary to achieve the purposes ofthe community college.
- 138 (12) Within the framework provided by law, determine the district's academic
- 139 calendar, including the holidays it will observe.

- (13) Hold and convey property for the use and benefit of the district. The
 governing board may acquire by eminent domain any property necessary to
 carry out the powers or functions of the district.
- (14) Participate in the consultation process established by the board ofgovernors for the development and review of policy proposals.
- (c) In carrying out the powers and duties specified in subdivision (b) or other
 provisions of statute, the governing board of each community college district
 shall have full authority to adopt rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the
 regulations of the board of governors and the laws of this state, that are
 necessary and proper to executing these prescribed functions.
- (d) Wherever in this section or any other statute a power is vested in the
- 151 governing board, the governing board of a community college district, by
- 152 majority vote, may adopt a rule delegating the power to the district's chief
- 153 executive officer or any other employee or committee as the governing board
- 154 may designate. However, the governing board shall not delegate any power that
- is expressly made nondelegable by statute. Any rule delegating authority shall
- 156 prescribe the limits of the delegation.
- (e) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2014.
