- 7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes.
- 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities.
- 9. Processes for program review.
- 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development.
- 11. Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

Consult Collegially means that the district governing board shall develop policies on academic and professional matters through either or both of the following:

• Rely primarily upon the advice and judgment of the academic senate, OR

The governing board, or its designees, and the academic senate shall reach mutual agreement by written resolution, regulation, or policy of the governing board effectuating such recommendations.

The intro to online education and Accessibility courses are going to be required to be approved as an online instructor at Crafton. ? Are there quality standards for online courses? In the process of creating. Need to balance the standards with academic freedom. Did a survey of the students who enrolled in the college but didn't take any classes. 30% mentioned a time issue. More online classes might be a good solution. This is an assumption we need to verify.

Our college going rates are lower than the surrounding counties. Many students in are service area are choosing to go to Community college but not CHC. CHC now has contracts with 5 high schools. Looking at adding 2 more. High school assumes the cost of the classes. Have hired a coordinator. Using money from the courses to pay that salary. Also using some equity funding. Also hiring part time counselors for each high school. Issues with student systems communicating. Appears to be a self-sustaining program. ? Are the hiring going through the union? Coordinator is not faculty. Counseling person is faculty- hired like all part time counselors. Need to identify our target population before offering the classes.
