- 9. Processes for program review.
- 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development.
- 11. Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

Consult Collegially means that the district governing board shall develop policies on academic and professional matters through either or both of the following:

• Rely primarily upon the advice and judgment of the academic senate, OR

The governing board, or its designees, and the academic senate shall reach mutual agreement by written resolution, regulation, or policy of the governing board effectuating such recommendations.

Building/room safety is an issue both in being able to secure as well as physical layout issues. Police are working on coming up with a comprehensive safety plan. ? When will the research and the plan be completed? Completed by the end of the year (December), but implementation will take much longer. Many of the physical changes will take place once renovations begin. Soonest, probably one year for some locations, full change could take up to 5 years. ?
