

Academic Senate Primary Function and Conducting Business

The primary function of the Academic Senate is to make recommendations with respect to academic and professional matters, including policy development. These Academic and Professional matters are known as the 10+1 ("Ten Plus One") and include the following:

- 1. Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites.
- 2. Degree and certificate requirements.
- 3. Grading policies.
- 4. Educational program development.
- 5. Standards or policies regarding student preparation and success.
- 6. College governance structures, as related to faculty roles.
- 7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes.
- 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities.
- 9. Processes for program review.
- 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development.
- 11. +1: Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

Consult Collegially requires that the district governing board shall develop policies on academic and professional matters through either or both of the following:

- 1. Rely primarily upon the advice and judgment of the academic senate, OR
- 2. The governing board, or its designees, and the academic senate shall reach mutual agreement by written resolution, regulation, or policy of the governing board effectuating such recommendations.

			If the articulation is approved, it will then be housed in MAP where Veterans can upload their JST's and see what credit they will be awarded at Crafton and other schools that are a part of MAP. As of right now, there are approximately 12 schools that are working towards building these articulations; however, Norco college, who is the leader of this program, has just onboarded another 50 community colleges that will start housing articulations in MAP. The goal is to have all California community colleges represented in MAP and to have MAP become a part of the exit process when a service member is exited from the military.
