3. Grading policies.
4. Educational program development.
5. Standards or policies regarding student preparation and success.
6. College governance structures, as related to faculty roles.
7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes.
8. Policies for faculty professional development activities.
9. Processes for program review.
10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development.
11. Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

Consult Collegially means that the district governing board shall develop policies on academic and professional matters through either or both of the following:

- Rely primarily upon the advice and judgment of the academic senate, OR

The governing board, or its designees, and the academic senate shall reach mutual agreement by written resolution, regulation, or policy of the governing board effectuating such recommendations.

<b>Credit By Exam and Dual Enrollment (10 mins)</b>	There is a current board policy about the number of units you have to have to take credit by exam (12 units). Can't make any local changes without addressing it at the District level. Will come back again. Pros and cons for changing this. Need to check on any state regulations that may impact.	
<b>AP/BP 3570 (5 mins)</b>	Smoke Free Campus – would not support a reprimand of any kind. Removing designated areas just makes more work for grounds to deal with cigarette butts all over. <b>Campus Safety/Active Shooter (15 mins)</b>	Received an email 2 weeks after the incident. Cameras were not functioning in the library. Is this a Union issue? Yes, have addressed it in negotiations. Should we invite an admin to come in an answer questions? Should have the police chief come. Have offered active shooter training, but have not been well attended. Should do trainings on mandatory in service days. Do we have a list of all the classrooms that don't lock? No. Need to get that list to make the campus aware. Some locks require a key. We don't have keys to every room, part timers don't have keys. Not faculty job to find out this information. Our district is understaffed in terms of police presence. Mike Strong is responsible for the Emergency Preparedness plan for our campus. Michael Wyn is the district person. All incidents that pose a risk should be communicated. Cameras need to be addressed. Locks are expensive but need to be installed/upgraded. Will work on this in Exec.	
<b>Announcements</b>	Upcoming theatre show on stalking – Boy Meets Girl. Delves into the psychology of a stalking – this Friday and Saturday. Call to Action was presented to students, they are planning on attending. Iris is having an exhibit in the gallery. Mark will be conducting the Fontana USD Honors Orchestra in Fontana, with an original composition. College letters are coming in – have had 6 music students accepted to universities in California and Nevada.
