Approval of minutes for December 10, 2019	The minutes for December 10, 2019 were approved as written. Motion by Keith, seconded by Brandi. Unanimous approval.	
Emergency Prep and Safety Training - Mike	Mike was following up the In-Service safety presentation. SBCCD Police have been scheduling appointments to review buildings for active shooter training, we have installed several AEDs (Automated External Defibrillator) on campus and he has reached out to Rick Hogrefe, Professional Development Coordinator to add AED and CPR training for flex day.	
	Michael Nguyen, the Environmental Health and Safety Administrator at the District is working on getting all mandatory safety training up to date with all employees.	
	Mike stated that the safety committee is looking into creating an online safety request form which would work similar to maintenance work orders. This would help by assigning to the proper department to review, follow-up and close the case once a solution is determined/implemented. This is in addition to hazard reporting procedures.	
	Mark indicated that the safety resolution in the Academic Senate failed by 2/3 of the vote and is no longer an issue. Faculty were pleased with the safety training at In-Service and procedures that have been implemented.	
	Mike said the safety committee members have been encouraged to report back to their constituency groups with any new information.	
Power Outage Update - Mike	Mike reported that after the last power outage, Edison completed a temporary fix including replacing bushings on the top of the transformer and was ordering a new transformer. They now have indicated that they will not be replacing the transformer and the fix is now the permanent solution.	
	Mike is still accumulating all the costs associated with the losses across campus. Right now it is approximately \$35,000.

Facility Master Plan Update – Mike and Kevin	Mike distributed the Measure CC timeline for review. Currently we are requesting RFQP for projects and need to select consultants. Hopefully the gym demo will start in Fall. They are in the process of selling the bonds. During the summer we will be completing site lighting control upgrades and upgrading the irrigation controllers.	
	Kevin has sent a request to Jose that CHC be allocated more funding from the Measure CC money. We are currently allocated 20% and we are asking for an increase to 37% in order to fund several projects on the Facility Master Plan list. If the money received is less than requested, we will review which of the prioritized projects will be completed to support the campus for the next 20 years.	
	Kevin indicated that in our plan we identified construction of a new soccer field. There was an MOU created with the City of Yucaipa to create some tennis courts. After further discussion, the City of Yucaipa is now going through the engineering process to re-direct this area to a soccer field. The funds needed for construction will come from Redevelopment funds and not our Measure CC monies.	
	We are still exploring the parcel across the street on Sand Canyon Road. We are close to starting a dialogue with the property owners. This is 19 acres of buildable land that possibly would be used for student/faculty/staff housing.	

Committee Assignments – Kevin	Kevin has requested that Academic Senate and Classified Senate provide their committee assignments for 2020-2021 by May 1, 2020 instead of in the Fall. This will allow the committees to start meeting right after the beginning of the Fall semester. Tyrone indicated that he will request the Student Senate to discuss committee assignments prior to their general assembly.
