


Foundation Financial Contributions





THE FREE COLLEGE PROMISE

- ► The Free College Promise Program is a new opportunity for students starting with the high school graduating Class of 2019.
- ➤ The Free College Promise Program allows a student to attend college full-time
 - ► Earn an associates degree
 - ► Transfer to a four-year university
 - ► Get a career training certificate





Benefits for Promise Students

- ▶ 2 consecutive years of free tuition
- Free access to textbooks
- ► Free access to a Chromebook rental
- ► \$300 per year for college expenses
- ► Priority B class registration
- Individual student support and college advising
- Opportunity for paid work experience
- ► A summer bridge program to help assist transition from high school to college





Requirements for Promise Students

- ► Attend a summer bridge program
- ► Enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 units each semester
- ► Maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA or above each semester
- ► Meet with a counselor at least once each semester to update their student educational plan
- ► Attend semester check-in meetings and submit progress reports for all enrolled classes
- Participate in at least one campus activity each semester
