

Public Higher Education Cost

University of California (top 9%)

- 10 Universities
- 250,000 students
- \$13,900 Tuition, \$15,800 Housing
 - \$29,700 Annual Cost

California State University (top 30%)

- 23 Universities
- 450,000 students
- \$5,742 Tuition, \$11,670 Housing
 - \$17,412 Annual Cost

California Community Colleges (top 100%)

- 114 Colleges (115 coming soon)
- 2,200,000 students
- \$46 per unit
 - \$1,380 Annual Cost

California Community Colleges

- California community colleges train 80% of firefighters, paramedics, and emergency medical technicians
- 31% of UC and 52% of CSU graduates started at a California community college
- Transfer students to UC system currently account for 48% of STEM bachelor's degrees awarded




- ► We serve 4,575 FTES


- Expanded Transfer Center



Educational Attainment for Residents age 25 and older




Crafton Hills Feeder HS Enrollments
