Rationale for New Program proposal

There is a persistent and growing need for quality LVNs in the Inland Empire. According to the Inland/Empire Centers of Excellence Labor Market Analysis (2025), "The number of jobs related to the middle-skill occupation – Licensed Vocational Nurses – is projected to increase by 9% through 2028, with 846 annual job openings (new and replacement jobs) and the occupations wages are above living wage at the 25th percentile hourly wage at \$30.35 in IE/D". There is a gap of 326 Vocational Nurses in the IED over the next five years. LVN programs are small by nature and multiple programs in the region are needed to meet the workforce demand.

Catalog Description

The Vocational Nursing (VN) Program is a comprehensive, competency-based program designed to prepare students for entry-level practice as Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVNs) in a variety of healthcare settings. Grounded in a novice to expert framework, the curriculum supports students' progressive development from novice learners to competent, practice-ready professionals. Instruction is structured to build clinical reasoning, technical proficiency, and professional behaviors across a continuum of learning experiences, from foundational to advanced levels of care.

The program emphasizes safe, patient-centered, and evidence-based care across the lifespan, with focused instruction in medical-surgical, maternal-child, mental health, geriatric, and community health nursing. Through didactic content, clinical simulation, supervised patient care, and structured remediation, students integrate knowledge, skills, and attitudes essential for vocational nursing practice.

The curriculum is aligned with the Quality and Safety Education for Nurses (QSEN) competencies, ensuring that students develop expertise in patient-centered care, teamwork and collaboration, evidence-based practice, quality improvement, safety, and informatics. Emphasis is placed on ethical practice, cultural competence, leadership, and interprofessional collaboration to meet the diverse and evolving needs of patients and communities.

Graduates of the program are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN) and are prepared to provide high-quality care as contributing members of the healthcare team. The program meets the standards established by the California Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT) and supports student success through a combination of academic rigor, hands-on training, and individualized support.

Program Goals and Objectives

The goal of the Vocational Nursing Program is to prepare compassionate, competent, and practice-ready entry-level vocational nurses who provide safe, patient-centered, and evidence-based care to individuals and families across the lifespan. Graduates will function effectively under the supervision of a licensed physician or registered nurse, demonstrating accountability, ethical integrity, and legal responsibility in accordance with the Vocational Nurses Code of Ethics and the Nurse Practice Act. The program aims to develop vocational nurses who are capable of integrating clinical reasoning, leadership principles, caring behaviors, and collaborative practices in diverse healthcare environments. Emphasis is placed on the application of nursing informatics, technology, and interprofessional communication to promote optimal patient outcomes and continuous improvement in healthcare delivery. Through progressive learning experiences rooted in the Novice to Expert framework and aligned with QSEN competencies, graduates will be equipped to meet the evolving needs of patients, healthcare systems, and the broader community.

The program is projecting to have 15-20 successful completers annually.

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Summary of Recommendations

Advisory Committee Recommendations – 2025 LVN Regional Meeting

1. Program Expansion & Labor Market Alignment

Recommendation: Expand LVN program capacity across the region to address a 326-position annual supply gap.

Rationale: Regional labor market data shows strong growth (9% through 2028) and 846 annual job openings.

Action: Colleges are encouraged to seek funding, expand dual admissions, and leverage apprenticeship models to increase enrollment.

2. Degree Pathways

Recommendation: Promote associate degree options in LVN programs.

Rationale: Although not required for licensure, 74% of job postings prefer an associate degree, and it supports seamless LVN-to-RN progression.

Action: Colleges without the AS in VN should explore developing the degree. Dual-degree pathways were highlighted as beneficial.

3. Wage Data Accuracy

Recommendation: Use real-time employer data to reflect actual LVN wages more accurately in LMI reports.

Rationale: Employers report average starting wages of \$29–\$30/hour, significantly higher than state-reported medians (\$38,000/year).

Action: Document and share employer-verified wage data for stakeholders and program planning.

4. Curriculum Alignment with BVNPT

Recommendation: Ensure LVN programs are fully aligned with updated BVNPT regulations.

Rationale: Some colleges need to adjust program hours and prerequisite structures to comply.

Action: Continue dialogue in upcoming CoP meetings; support programs facing faculty shortages impacting compliance.

5. Apprenticeship Development

Recommendation: Expand LVN and healthcare-related apprenticeship programs.

Rationale: Employers expressed strong interest in CNA-to-LVN, LVN-to-RN, and new roles like simulation specialists.

Action: Schedule a Launch Apprenticeship Panel to educate employers and colleges on implementation steps.

6. Graduate Tracking and Outcomes

Recommendation: Implement systems for tracking graduate employment and licensure outcomes.

Rationale: Most colleges lack formal mechanisms, limiting their ability to report workforce outcomes.

Action: Consider tools like LinkedIn, alumni surveys, and program-level dashboards.

7. Workforce Preparedness & Skills Gaps

Recommendation: Enhance curriculum focus on wound care, documentation, leadership, and communication skills.

Rationale: Employers stressed the need for LVNs with strong clinical and soft skills for success in modern healthcare settings.

8. AI Readiness in Nursing Education

Recommendation: Continue building AI literacy and ethical use in LVN curricula.

Rationale: AI is emerging in healthcare, and nurses must be prepared to engage with evolving technologies.

Action: Promote participation in the upcoming AI in Healthcare Education Workshop hosted by IEDRC.

9. Address Regional Hiring Needs

Recommendation: Strengthen college-employer pipelines to meet current job demand.

Rationale: Employers reported 30+ open LVN positions across the region and expressed urgent staffing needs.

Action: Collaborate with local districts and clinics to streamline hiring pipelines and share job openings with students.

10. Support for New Programs

Recommendation: Approve and support new LVN programs, such as the Crafton Hills College proposal.

Rationale: Advisory members unanimously approved the new program, which integrates apprenticeship and long-term care.

Action: Submit documentation to CCCCCO and provide mentorship to emerging programs.
