Review and approve minutes from 10-14-25	Minutes from 10/14/25 were approved as written. Motion by Keith, seconded by Karen. No opposition. No abstentions. Motion approved.
Strategic Direction 5 - Gio	- Gio sent link to SD5 to review and add comments. - Reviewed all comments. - Several items were changed from in progress to complete.
Mountain Community Strategic Direction – Gio/Kevin	Kevin spoke about adding a new Strategic Direction to our existing Educational Master Plan about the inclusion of the Mountain Community since this is a change for CHC. Gio reviewed the existing Strategic Directions, Supporting Actions and Key Results to see where the best fit occurs. Here is what he proposed: - SD1: Increase Student Enrollment Supporting Action 1: Develop and implement strategies to increase dual enrollment ADD Key Results: ➤ Increase the dual enrollment FTES in the mountain communities from 13 in 2024-25 to 26 (100% increase) by 2027-28. ➤ Increase the dual enrollment sections in the mountain communities from 11 in 2024-25 to 16 (45% increase) by 2027-28. ➤ Increase total FTES by students living in mountain communities from 101 in 2024-25 to 140 (39% increase) by 2027-28.
