Old Business:  I. Budget Enrollment Discussion  2. Classified Senate Logo	1. Mike Strong discussed the May revise and that it looks to be going in a positive direction for Crafton. The growth funding for the state went down to 1%. For Crafton, we will get a 1.72% increase. COLA has increased from 1.48% to 1.56%. Crafton will be receiving the Physical Plant and Block Grant again which is for restructive purposes or to use for instructional equipment. Went up from \$500,000 to \$1.9 million for District, which will be received in April 2018. He discussed the Resource Allocation Model: Sections A, B, and C are revenues; D is assessments that the District will hold back for their expenses; E is site expenses; and F is adjustments. At first, it was a \$1.6 million deficit, but now it is \$1.3 million. It will change, again, according to Mike once the official numbers come in. Kathy Bakhit discussed enrollment. There is a need to add FTES without cost. If 2 more students were added per section this would help solve the issue. On average, the sections are allowed 35 in each. For English, it is 25. Instructors can increase their section seats by asking Kathy. Currently, it is an average 24.15 students, but the goal is 27 average.
