January Governor's Budget Proposal and CCCCO Joint Analysis	Mike reviewed the proposed state budget submitted by the governor in January. After this the legislature reviews and submits concerns. After that process, changes are made and the next step is the submission of the May revise. The State Chancellor's Office does a joint analysis from the governor's January submission and review of the legislature concerns. Highlights include: Increase of 8% from last year Prop 98 designates 11% of the budget to education K-14 Community Colleges are only up 14.1 to 14.5 (billion) 2.43% COLA adjustment that feeds into based funding formula and some categorical funding There was a hold harmless that kept funding at the 2017-2018 level during COVID but this is ending. There will be a new floor set in 2025-2026 based on FTES achieved in 2024-2025.
