SBCCD Enrollment Targets	Since we have some new committee members, Mike suggested that we include how the State funds colleges overview at our next meeting. The Enrollment as of August 6, 20XX shows our funding levels, targets and helps us strategize how to increase funding. CHC represents 32% of the District's FTES. For the period of 2021-2024 we received higher funding that our actuals. During this time the State issued a Hold Harmless and paid us more than our actuals. This saved us from a huge budget crisis. This Hold Harmless ended 2024-2025. Starting in 2025-2026 will fund us again based on actuals. We are projecting higher than the funding amount. We may grow 13% but we may only get a little less. We are banking on other institutions not achieving their goals and then the state reallocates that money to Districts like us. This is based on a three-year average. This average disproportionately impacts smaller colleges than larger ones. Angel Rodriguez is our government liaison person. We will relay issues to Angele, he goes to Sacramento, meets with our representatives and advocates to them. 11% of general fund of state budget is committed to K014 education. What typically happens is they will fund a special project i.e. student equity or basic needs and that money is taken	Put on next agenda
