A Brief Overview



AB-928 — The Student Transfer Reform Act (2021)

- Effort to increase transfer numbers from the California Community College to the CSU and UC.
 - Creation of an Intersegmental Implementation Committee (ICAS).
 - Place all CCC students on a transfer associates degree pathway if a student declares a goal of transfer and the pathway exists.
 - Creation of a singular lower division general education pathway that meets transfer admission to both CSU and UC.

What we currently have at CHC.

- Crafton Hills College General Education Pattern (CHCGE)
 - 19 units total
 - Designed for homegrown degrees
 - Satisfies pre-requisites for programs such as respiratory and radiology
- California State University, General Education Pattern (CSUGE)
 - Designed exclusively for CSU transfer students
 - Most CHC students follow this pattern
- Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)
 - Designed for both CSU and UC transfer. Usually accepted by private and out-of-state institutions.

Going from 3 GE Patterns to 2.

- CHCGE Pattern No changes as of now
- Combining CSUGE with IGETC

The CalGETC pathway as proposed by ICAS is as follows:

Changes – Areas Added

- Oral communication is now a requirement
- Addition of Ethnic Studies requirement

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Changes – Areas removed or modified

- No additional Arts or humanities course.
 - One course from the Arts.
 - One course from the humanities.
- Only two social science courses (three previously).
- Elimination of Area E Life Long Learning and Self Development.
- LOTE no longer required for GE certification.

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Predicted Instructional Impacts

- CSUGE AREA E courses will be most impacted particularly:
 - HEALTH
 - COUNSELING
- Foreign Languages and LOTE:
 - LOTE will still be a UC graduation requirement that students can complete at CHC.
 - Humanities under CSUGE included ASL 101, SPAN 101, JAPN 101
 - Humanities under IGETC included ASL 102, SPAN 103, JAPN 103
- Communications should see an increase in enrollment:
 - COMMST 100, 111 & 140

Predicted Instructional Impacts

- Ethnic Studies will see a continued increase in enrollment.
 - Area 6 is a dedicated area that students must complete for certification.
- May see some changes in Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences
 - Additional courses from the Arts and Humanities as well as Social Sciences are proposed to be cut due to the inclusion of Oral Communicationn and Ethnic Studies.
- Math, Sciences, English and Critical Thinking should see no change.
 - MATH 103 was not accepted in IGETC but could be in Cal-GETC.
