ARCC CHC Description – Keith	The ARCC CHC Description was reviewed, updated and changes were made. The final description submitted is: Crafton Hills College serves over 7,500 students. Located in the foothills of Yucaipa, the campus has a park-like setting with welcoming open spaces. The College's focus is to help students engage, learn, and advance. With over 40 degrees and 30 certificates, the college offers a diverse catalog of courses and Student Life activities to facilitate learning through career education and academic transfer. The faculty and staff serve students via mentoring relationships, contributing to a rich, balanced college experience.	
Policies and Procedures – All	All Administrative Procedures and Board Policies must go through District Assembly and they will only discuss the ones listed on their agenda each month. We have received three hard copies of the Administrative Procedures and Board Policies in Chapter Six Business and Fiscal Affairs. Cyndie has set up a shared drive for all members of Crafton Council to have an electronic version of Chapter Six. Per Stacey at the Chancellor's Office we are to use Track Changes on the documents and she has requested all changes be submitted to her by March 31, 2014.	
Student Success Initiative Update – Rebeccah	Rebeccah spoke about the Update to the Educational Master Plan Committee on Student Success Track Force Initiative Projects. The Task Force is continuing to work on areas strengthening support for entering students including ramping up assessment orientation to include an on-line orientation. We are looking at an on-line Spanish orientation. We have not purchased this yet but our vendor says it is available. Recommendation 2.5 would require students to declare a major early. We don't require that now. We have assessment tools to help students to decide on a major.	

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Accreditation Updates Report Progress- Rebeccah 	Rebeccah reported the self-evaluation report is proceeding. We have completed substantial portions of Standard 1 and 2; it is going more slowly and not much progress on Standard 3; and assignments have been made on Standard 4. Need to lean on Standard Chairs. Rebeccah is meeting with Glen Kuck, Amalia Perez, Tim Oliver and Haragewen Kinde to go over Human Resources, Student Services and Facilities information. Keith Wurtz, Jose Torres and Rebeccah will submit the annual report to ACCJC by the end of the month. One of the things holding up writers is they need to attach their narrative to evidence. Please make sure that committees post minutes online. This will help with the documentation process. Rebeccah participated in a mock accreditation site visit at RCC last month. She felt it was very helpful. She would like to do one here in August. There will be a Study Session on Accreditation and Board related Accreditation Standards and Final Draft

We have been talking with Inland Leaders and the Yucaipa/Calimesa Joint Unified School District. Redlands Unified School District has Redlands eAcademy online school and currently are looking at more classes. Bryan Reece met with Sherman Indian High School in Riverside. Looking at concurrent enrollment classes. We could get credit for the FTE. This could get more high school students enrolled in college. The Statewide budget will fund us for actual
