Review and Approval of Minutes of August 26, 2014 meeting	This item was tabled until next meeting.	
Debrief on Budget Study Session - Cheryl	One time money of \$1 million was added to balance budget. The breakdown of this is \$600,000 Student Success money and \$400,000 is funded FTES. The money will be allocated based on deficits shown. There is also a savings factor included in the budget. This is money in the budget we can't spend. For Crafton it is \$238,000.	
	We currently have 9 faculty vacancies. Of the nine, we have filled 7 with interims and 2 with adjuncts. Faculty interim positions are business, fire, chemistry (new position), Health and Wellness, DSPS, and two tutoring positions. The two adjuncts are in respiratory and math. In addition, we have an interim dean (Mark Snowhite).	
	We have 5 classified positions being filled: Secretary II in EMS, Custodian I, Library Tech II, Admin Secretary and Secretary I for Instruction.	
	Two deans currently share one Admin Secretary position. We are adding a Secretary I as a first step in providing support. This position will expand services, help with SLOs, make copies and possibly take committee minutes including Academic Senate, Classified Senate, Safety, etc.	
	Classified positions not being filled include 3 custodians (ideally we need 5), Research Assistant and Data Specialist for Institutional Effectiveness, Research and Planning, and the EMS Lab Technician position. We must determine how to prioritize these positions. Criteria need to be determined to form objective decisions.	

	Kim McCormick is retiring this month. This will create a vacancy. Alternative funding streams will be explored. If grant or categorical, what are the restrictions on utilizing these funds? Michelle Tinoco asked about the Hay Group study. We are still waiting for the report which was due months ago. One issue was which colleges to use as reference points. Mike indicated the budget forecast looking to future years does not include additional operational expenditures with the new buildings. It is based on 2.2% growth projection that may not be accurate. The 7 year projection only calculates step increases. The district is receiving a \$1.9 million Instructional Equipment/Physical Block Grant. This money is not being split on allocations but on need. This year there is no match requirement. A priority list has been established. CHC was allocated \$84,400.00 for Instructional Equipment. Our list of how we are spending this money is due to the State on October 1, 2014. Please remind people to put in their resource requests. Make sure they are tied to
