Review and Approval of Minutes of December 9, 2014	The minutes for December 9, 2014 meeting were approved as corrected.	
Construction Update – Mike	OE2 is relatively on schedule and we should move in for Fall. The science building is behind schedule. The builder still thinks they can complete by 07-14-15. We are skeptical and estimate completion in September. Crafton Center is on schedule and should be complete the end of October. Student Services to start moving the end of November and then the other departments will move in. The Physical Education building has a problem with the dance floor. We are unable to use the dance floor as the wood is buckling and we will need to replace.
