DISCUSSION **Further Action TOPIC** Review and Approval of The minutes for the meeting on February 23, 2016, were Minutes of 02-23-16 approved as written. **Priority Registration** Cheryl asked the committee to add this agenda item. It was Applications – Kirsten unanimously approved. Colvey The SSEEM Committee has received 5 applications for Priority Registration. After review of three applications (two more will be presented next meeting), they are recommending the following programs receive priority registration for Fall 2016: Athletics - Priority "B" for 6 semesters or until the student no longer is a member of a team. Left Lane – Priority "C" for 1st semester and Priority "B" for the 2nd and 3rd semesters students participate and complete requirements of the program. RESA – Redlands Emergency Services Academy – Priority "B" for first semester only. **By consensus**, Crafton Council approves the Priority Registration recommendations of the SSEEM Committee for Fall 2016. STEM Grant: Due date is May 2, 2016. This needs to be determined prior to submitting the grant and shared with Crafton Council prior to submitting the grant. Strengthening Working Families Initiative Inland Empire: Part of the Gateway College Initiative with Loma Linda. They are responsible for writing the grant. They are writing us into the grant for a couple of our counselors to go over to Loma Linda University. They would include an hourly wage plus benefits in the grant. We would be a minor partner. There are two benefits to being included: • We could offer EMT classes in San Bernardino (new buildina) Access to students who would want to come to Crafton increase FTEs Cheryl will send out Hiring Status - Cheryl We are adding several faculty positions: 2 English faculty (one due to pending retirement and one email to campus for Papas position) 1 history faculty (Jane retiring) 1 respiratory (Amber resigning) Cheryl indicated she is working on the leadership roles that need to be filled. Reassign time will be included: Middle College High School Coordinator International Coordinator Non-Credit Coordinator **Honors Coordinator Professional Development Coordinator** Possibly a Project Director if we get STEM grant The Substantive Change Proposal for Distance Education and the Cyndie to put Accreditation Update-Final ACCJC Follow-up Report have been submitted to March Distance Ed Plan as Cheryl board. The Final ACCJC Follow-up Report will be mailed after information item on board approval. The deadline to submit is March 15, 2016. We **April Board** need to submit the Distance Education Plan as an information item to April board. The Follow-up site visit is scheduled for April 13-14, 2016. There will be 2-3 team members including Dr. Barry Russell. Tentatively they will be at the district on April 13th and here at Crafton on April 14th. To be confirmed. Cheryl stated that there will be discussion at the CEO Symposium regarding which accrediting commission to use going forward, ACCJC or WASC Senior. We are the only area that has a bifurcated system.

EMP/FMP Update - Consultants	We are working with Alma Strategies for information from their interviews, analysis of the environmental scan data and space utilization data. The goal is to have a draft of the EMP the end of March. There will be campus dialogue (open forum on March 28 th) and Cheryl would like it included in the April 12 th flex day agenda.	
Enrollment Update – Bryan	Our original target FTE was 4864 and it did not look like we would meet our target. It was revised to 4743 and Bryan indicated we are estimating 4781 (surpassing new target). In the past we were not counting some tutoring since we pay for it with Equity funding. A ruling from the State Chancellor's Office went with Title V language and we are able to include these. Valley estimates they will be 330 below their target. The Redlands partnership pilot is moving forward. Had some hiccups and improvements will be made.	
Remaining Meetings	We have started the roll up process for planning and resource allocation. The departments have sent them to the divisions for further prioritization and then on to the Vice Presidents. Bryan to send out an email to the deans with the due dates.
