Review and Approval of Minutes of 04-26-16	The minutes for the meeting on April 26, 2016, were approved as presented.

IEAOC Get It Done Proposal – Bryan	List as presented. The IEAOC Get It Done proposal was presented to Professional Development Committee on Friday and it was approved. The purpose of this proposal is to change the In-Service format and rebrand as "Get it Done Day" and reorganize the activities of the day around practical learning activities. The goal is to focus our day around learning AND knock out much of the assessment work that is typically required to be done at other times during the year. Accreditation Update- Rebeccah Warren- Marlatt	Rebeccah reported that Crafton has received a report from Dr. Russell regarding the follow-up visit. We are checking it for errors of fact. The Commission will meet in June to make its determination of our accreditation status.

IEPI Targets - Gio In 2014 legislation established a new system of indicators and goals that are intended to encourage improvement in institutional effectiveness at California community colleges. Pursuant to Education Code section 84754.6, the Board of Governors (BOG) adopted a goals framework at its March 16, 2015 meeting to measure the ongoing condition of a community college's operational environment. This statute also requires that, as a condition of receipt of Student Success and Support program funds, each community college develop, adopt, and post a goals framework that addresses, at a minimum, the following four areas: student performance and outcomes, accreditation status, fiscal viability, and programmatic compliance with state and federal guidelines. Each District and College has until June 15, 2016 to adopt eight short and long term goals, four District and four College Indicator Rate targets. The college has the choice of targeting completion rate of underprepared students OR basic skills remedial rates in math and English. The Academic Senate chose math and English remedial rate instead of underprepared completion rates and it adopted the targets recommended by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness, Research and Planning (OIERP). The information will be discussed at the Classified Senate meeting on Friday. Crafton Council approved the same targets adopted by Academic Senate, contingent upon the adoption of those same targets by Classified Senate. If Classified Senate wants to make any changes, we will send emails out to Crafton Council to finalize the dialogue. These targets will be presented to the board on June 9, 2016 and Dr. Keith Wurtz will give a power point presentation. The District is required to verify its adoption and posting of the goals framework and set the IEPI goals by June 15, 2016. **By Consensus**, Crafton Council approves the IEPI Targets as presented today. Basic Skills Grant: Richard Galope is writing a basic skills Grants - Gio partnership grant on behalf of SBVC. SBVC has reached out to us to partner with CSUSB and Cal Poly Pomona. The grant would entail us offering basic skills instruction to students either

here at CHC or their location or possibly a third site. We have not yet received any drafts of the application and it is due in approximately a week. There was concern to make sure the grant approval document should include input from the unions. Gio will send a link with the grant information. The funding is from the State Chancellor's Office. Given the time constraints, Crafton Council agreed to refrain from participating in the grant.
